



Ensure Your Vote is COUNTED on Election Day, Tuesday, Nov. 3, 2020

PRE-REQUISITES

- U.S. Citizen
- At least 18 years of age by Election Day, November 3, 2020
- A Florida resident
- Florida driver's license or other government photo ID
- Have not been convicted of a felony, unless your voting rights have been restored
- Have not been adjudged mentally incompetent

STEP 1 REGISTER TO VOTE & CHECK ACCURACY

Check the Accuracy of [your current voter registration](#) or **Register to Vote** for the first time [online](#) or [by mail](#) any time on/before **Monday, October 5**. If registering by mail, your registration must be RECEIVED by your [Supervisor of Elections](#) on/before **Monday, October 5; otherwise, you cannot vote on Election Day. Don't delay, pledge to check the accuracy of your voter status or register to vote by September 30.**

STEP 2 REQUEST YOUR ABSENTEE BALLOT

Florida allows the option for all registered voters to request a mail-in ballot (no excuse needed). However, you must [request a mail-in ballot](#) on/before **Saturday, October 24**; otherwise, you have to physically vote in-person. Florida will not automatically send mail-in ballots, if not requested. (Note: You must first be registered to vote before you can request a mail-in ballot.) Your request for a mail-in ballot must be POSTMARKED to your [Supervisor of Elections](#) before **Saturday, October 24. Don't delay, pledge to request your absentee ballot by September 30.**

STEP 3 CAST YOUR VOTE

Cast your vote by **mailing-in** your completed and SIGNED mail-in ballot, which must be RECEIVED by your [Supervisor of Elections](#) by **Election Day, Tuesday, November 3** or by dropping off your ballot at secure drop boxes at Supervisor of Elections' main and branch offices and early voting sites. Officials recommend mailing your mail-in ballot by **Tuesday, October 27. Don't delay, pledge to mail-in your completed absentee ballot at least two weeks in advance by October 20.**

- OR -

Cast your vote **early in-person** at your correct voting place. Early voting is required to be minimally open statewide from **Saturday, October 24 to Saturday, October 31**. However, in some counties, early voting can open as early as **Monday, October 19**, and end as late as **Sunday, November 1**. Check with your [Supervisor of Elections](#) for open dates for your county. A list of early voting locations and their hours will become available closer to Election Day, Tuesday, November 3. **Don't delay, pledge to physically cast your vote early before October 27.**

- OR -

Cast your vote **in-person** on **Election Day, Tuesday, November 3**, by **7:00 pm** at your correct [polling place](#). **Don't delay, pledge to physically cast your vote in the morning on Election Day, November 3.**

STEP 4 CELEBRATE YOUR VOTE
