Recommendations are now forwarded to the City Commission.



OTHER FEDERAL: ARTS + SOCIAL IMPACT EXPLORER https://ww2.americansforthearts.org/explorer Ongoing Creative Economy Legislation:

- AEAF/Arts Education for All Act (HR 5581) supports universal arts ed from pre-K through 12th grade.
- **CREATE Act** (HR 6381 / S.3521) aligns policy to serve those that make our creative economy prosper.
- **PLACE Act** (HR 6569 / S.3560) bolsters local creative economies and workers in creative industries.
- **CERA/**Creative Economy Revitalization Act (HR 5019 / S. 2858) grants-creative workers/public projects.
- **PATPA**/Performing Artist Tax Parity Act of 2021 (S. 2872) for arts workers to deduct business expenses.
- 21CFWP/21st Century Federal Writers Project Act (HR 3054) will authorize a new grant program & create a
 nationally administered archives for the commissioned writing.
- STAR/Saving Transit Arts Resources Act (HR 2380) local transit authorities control art/non-functional landscaping in federally funded transit projects and historical/heritage societies and site

Florida 2024 Arts and Culture Grants

There are four line items within the Department of State Division of Arts & Culture Budget. They total \$68,081,092 and support 774 arts and cultural organizatons and artists. Applicants are required to match anywhere from 1:1 to 10:1, depending on the grant type and annual budget. Applicants must report quarterly to receive funds and annually to be eligible to apply in the future. *This is an increase of* 22 applications over last year and a decrease in the dollar amount by \$ 1,172,733.




Florida 2024 Arts and Culture Grants

Florida arts and culture grants are funded through the Department of State, Division of Arts and Culture by non-recurring revenue. Reporting on delivery of services and fiscal responsibility are integral to the program. Demonstration of stewardship and return on investment is a hallmark of the program and an imperative for grantee advocates.
